



ACCEPTING NEW CLIENTS

Deaf Children's Society of BC is now accepting new clients for Speech & Language Therapy services for children and young adults, birth to 18 years of age for on-line services during the COVID-19 epidemic, and in our Burnaby office when in-person services are reinstated.

We are committed to family-centred services, building on child & family strengths to achieve communication & language goals and social-emotional confidence & wellness. Services are offered in the form of assessment, consultation, direct therapy and the provision of home programs.

Our Speech-Language Pathologists (SLPs) are clinically certified by the Speech-Language & Audiology Canada and registered with the College of Speech and Hearing Health Professionals of British Columbia and trained to assess and treat a variety of communication needs.

Interventions Provided For:

- Language and Speech Development of Deaf/Hard of Hearing persons with and without Hearing Aids or Cochlear Implants
- Hearing, Hard-of-Hearing, Deaf
- Social Communication Needs
- Articulation Delays and Disorders
- Neurological Based Challenges such as Aphasia, Apraxia of Speech and Dysarthria
- Voice Disorders
- Accent Modification

Initial Consultation

The initial consultation is a free 30-minute session with an SLP and may include some informal assessment. In an initial consultation, clients are interviewed with their family to identify communication challenges, to determine what is most significant to them and to establish whether Deaf Children's Society is the best fit for them.

Assessment

Assessment can take from 1-4 sessions depending on the complexity of the challenges being assessed and client preference. The use of standardized speech and language assessment tools and informal measures are used to get a baseline of functioning and to establish specific, achievable goals.

Individual Treatment Session

Individualized treatment plans are created with clients and their families to incorporate the developmentally appropriate goals established during assessment with the personally relevant goals of the client's interests. The speech-language pathologist will target these goals in treatment sessions in motivating and functional ways.
